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## Directions to The Cape House

#### From New York:

Take I-95 North to 195 East in Providence. Continue to Route 495/25 East and follow the signs to Falmouth/The Islands. Cross the Bourne Bridge and take Route 28 South.

#### From Hartford

Take I-84 East to I-90 (Mass. Turnpike). Take I-90 East to I-495 South (Exit 11A). Continue on I-495/25, following signs for Falmouth/The Islands over the Bourne Bridge and take Route 28 South.

#### **From Boston**


Take Route 3 South to the Sagamore rotary. Take Route 6 West toward Buzzards Bay/ Falmouth. Cross the Bourne Bridge and take Route 28 South.

## From Bourne Bridge to The Cape House

Stay on Route 28 South for approximately 12 miles. One mile after the four-lane road turns into two lanes, take a left at the first light onto Jones Road. Proceed to the second traffic light and turn right onto Davis Straits Road. Continue approximately 1/4 mile and take the second left onto Falmouth Heights Road. Proceed 1/2 mile, pass the Island Queen Ferry and turn left onto Harbor Avenue. The Cape House is the first house on the left, 8 Harbor Avenue.

## About The Cape House



For more than 25 years, The Cape House has been privately owned and operated by three friends. We rent this house to families for vacations and reunions, as well as enjoy it for our own private use.







## **Beaches**

#### **Bristol Beach**

Go east along Grand Avenue away from Falmouth Heights into Marivista where you'll see several beaches along Nantucket Sound, including Bristol Beach.

## **Chapoquoit Beach**

Chapoquoit, often referred to by residents as "Chappy," used to be an island and is still sometimes referred to as such. It is located off Route 28A in West Falmouth beyond West Falmouth Harbor. It is roughly 500 feet long. This is the most popular beach for windsurfers after regular beach hours. Many dogwalkers and dune-explorers enjoy the entertainment of the windsurfers. This beach has a wonderful view for sunsets since it is so open and panoramic. There are no amenities and a resident parking sticker is required in season.

## Falmouth Heights Beach

Just to the east of Falmouth Inner Harbor facing Martha's Vineyard is Falmouth Heights Beach, located at Falmouth Heights Road and Grand Avenue. Situated in the Heights area of Falmouth and just a five-minute walk (3/10 of a mile) from The Cape House, the beach is a glorious stretch of white sand, great views and lots of summer fun. Across the street there are large fields with basketball courts, a baseball diamond and plenty of room for a soccer game or kite flying. The beach is just a short stroll from nearby restaurants and bicycle rental shops. Metered parking is available in limited supply.

#### **Menauhant Beach**

Off Route 28 and Central Avenue East Falmouth, MA. One of Falmouth's largest beaches. The beach wraps around both sides of the channel entrance to Bournes Pond and extends east to the entrance of Eel Pond. A lovely sand beach interspersed with large smooth rocks. On a clear day, you can see all the way to the Nobska Light House. The beach is roughly one mile long and 50 feet at its greatest width. Note that the beach drops off quickly into the ocean. Lifequards are on duty during the summer. This beach has plenty of parking, restrooms, changing rooms, and a concession stand. \$10 parking.

#### **Old Silver Beach**

Located in North Falmouth off of Route 28A. Old Silver Beach features perhaps the softest sand in Falmouth, a snack shop, and is divided into separate areas for residents and non-residents. Old silver is a popular beach and its parking lots, which are available to visitors and residents, fills quickly on weekends. The beach is divided into three sections. The north side is in front of the resident-only parking lot and abuts the Sea Crest Resort. The south side, where the beach is the widest, loops into a lagoon, where a creek separates the south side from the middle section. The creek is a favorite spot for young children and with a gently sloping entry into Buzzards Bay, it is often described as a childfriendly beach. There are many watersports offered on the beach side closest to The Sea Crest Resort. Concession stands, restrooms and changing rooms are available. \$10 parking.

#### **Surf Drive Beach**

On Surf Drive off Main and Shore Streets in Falmouth. Accessible from Shining Sea Bikeway. Roughly three-quarters of a mile long. The beach is best described by an array of activity along the road and in Vineyard Sound waters. Close proximity to the bike path and downtown Falmouth makes the beach a great spot for many local events. Surf Drive Beach is a favorite spot for vacationers and visitors to the Cape and Falmouth. Note that the beach drops off quickly into the ocean, However, there is a shallow area identified with floats for children to play and swim in. Concession stand, showers, beach house, restrooms. Life guards on duty. Pay-per-day parking. \$10 parking.

#### **Wood Neck Beach**

One of the most rustic and serene beaches of Falmouth. Tucked away in Sippewisset, just between a large salt marsh and Buzzards Bay. Wonderful sunsets. Falmouth's rockiest public beach. It has the charm of a giant saltwater aguarium that families and children can explore. There are two sides to the beach: the rock-covered main shore on Buzzards Bay and the creek side where the ocean water circles around a small beachfront and flows into Little Sippewisset Marsh. Tides determine the width of the beach as well as parking. Children enjoy Wood Neck because they can explore the sea life as well as play in the sand. Bring a chair instead of a towel. No amenities.

## **Beach Parking Stickers**

A parking sticker is required during the summer months to park your car at Falmouth area beaches. The price of a seasonal sticker for a non-resident is \$200.00. Weekly stickers are available for \$60.00. A two-week sticker will cost \$70.00, a three-week sticker \$80.00; and a four-week sticker \$90.00.

Parking stickers can be purchased at the Ellen T. Mitchell Bath House on Surf Drive in Falmouth.

(508) 759-4431 13 miles (round trip). This level and paved trail runs along the Cape Cod Canal from Bourne to Sandwich on the Cape side. Access Buzzard Bay recreation area west of the Bourne Bridge.

## **Cape Cod Rail Trail**

A scenic 25-mile route through the towns of Dennis, Harwich, Brewster, Orleans, Eastham and Wellfleet. One of the oldest and most popular rail trails in the country. Its paved surface, few hills and well-marked automobile crossings make it ideal for cyclists of all ages. The trail begins at Route 134 in South Dennis. There is free parking. For more information, contact Nickerson State Park at (508) 896-3491 or go online at www.massgov/massparks.

## Shining Sea Bike Path – Falmouth to Woods Hole

Winding by breaking surf and quiet woodland, Falmouth's 7.2 mile paved bike trails begins at Locust Street and Mill Road near downtown Falmouth and ends at Railroad Avenue in Woods Hole, with access points at Elm Road and Oyster Pond Road. Benches are located at scenic stops along the trail. There is ample parking opposite the entrance on Locust Street and highly limited parking at the Steamship Authority parking lot. Restrooms are available at the Steamship Authority Terminal.

Bike routes connect with the Shining Sea Trail at Oyster Pond and head along roads North and East. The northerly route traverses Quissett, Sippewissett, West Falmouth, Old Silver Beach and North Falmouth. The easterly route follows the water's edge from Falmouth Beach to Menahant Beach and Central Avenue.



# Frequently asked questions

## **Questions and Answers about The Cape House**

## Q. What time is check-in and check-out?

Our regular check-in time is 3:00 p.m. and check-out time is 9:00 a.m. We are flexible in allowing guests to check in early and stay late providing we don't have any other guest or groups conflicting with your stay. Please inquire before your arrival.

## Q. How do we get into The Cape House?

The Cape House will probably be open upon your arrival. If not, there is a push-button combination lock on the front door. See your confirmation letter for the lock code.

## Q. Where should we park our cars?

Please only park in the backyard. Park on an angle and keep the middle section of the yard open. This will facilitate easy access for all quests.

## Q. Do we need to bring our own linens?

Blankets, pillows and spreads are provided at The Cape House. Guests do need to bring the appropriate linens for the beds and towels. Check the house layout to determine the types of beds provided.

## Q. What kind of supplies are in the kitchen?

The kitchen at The Cape House is stocked with an assortment of pots, pans, mixing and serving bowls, baking sheets, dishes, bowls, silverware, drinking and wine glasses, mugs, cooking utensils, knives, cutting boards and more. There is enough equipment to prepare for and serve 25-30 people. The kitchen has two full size refrigerators, electric range and oven, microwave oven, toaster and coffee makers. (There is an extra refrigerator in the garage.) We provide dishwashing soap and clean up supplies. Guests are expected to wash, dry and put away the dishes they use.

## Q. Where do we find extra household supplies?

Extra supplies such as toilet paper, paper towels, garbage bags, pump soap, dish washing soap and light bulbs are found in the outside storage shed and in the hall closet across from the half bath on the first floor.

## Q. Is the house cleaned during our stay?

The Cape House is cleaned before you arrive and again after your group leaves. There is a central vacuum system throughout the house. The hose and nozzle are located in the downstairs hall closet if you feel the need to touch up during your stay. The vacuum hook ups are located in the kitchen behind the dining room door, at the foot of the stairs and in the upstairs hallway.

## Q. What do we do with trash and recyclables?

Full trash bags should be stored in the barrels in the shed located in the back yard. Recyclables (plastic, tin and glass) should go in the blue recycling bin in the garage. Newspapers can be placed in paper bags and stacked alongside the recycling bin in the garage. Any deposit cans or bottles that are not taken with you should be placed in the barrel at the foot of the deck steps. If this barrel gets full, please remove the bag and store in the shed. Be sure to reline the barrel with another trash bag.

#### Q. Are table linens provided?

We provide vinyl table clothes for the kitchen and dining room tables. They are kept in the drawers of the built-in hutch in the dining room. If you would like linen table clothes and napkins, you will need to rent or bring them.

## Q. Does the Cape House have grills and can they be moved around?

The Cape House has two large Webber gas grills. You never have to worry about running out of propane because these grills are hooked up to a master tank. As a result, the grills cannot be moved.

## Q. Are there laundry facilities?

There is a washer and dryer in the basement for guests to use.

### Q. What is the phone number of The Cape House?

The phone number of The Cape House is (508) 548-2872. This is a restricted line. For any calls outside Falmouth, you will need to use a personal calling card. There is no answering machine on the phone to receive messages. You need to dial the 508 area code for each local call.

#### Q. What about the neighbors and noise?

The Cape House is located in a quaint neighborhood on a roomy one-acre lot. The front of the house stands across from a motel, while the back of the house is abutted by residential properties. Please be courteous of our neighbors and refrain from loud noise after 9:00 pm.

#### Q. Are pets allowed?

Because some future guests may be allergic, The Cape House has a strict no pet policy.

#### Q. Is smoking permitted at The Cape House?

Smoking is not permitted in the house, on the deck or on the front porch of The Cape House.

#### Q. How far is The Cape House from the beach?

The house is just 3/10 of a mile (about a 5 minute walk) to the Falmouth Heights Beach.

#### Q. What should we do when we leave?

Please turn off the lights, turn the thermostat down (if necessary), pick up excess trash, wash and put away the dishes and leave the place in an orderly, broom swept manner. If you use the portable heaters located in the upstairs bedrooms, be sure to turn off and unplug the units.
